

Finding your way around.....Corinth

Corinth was one of the richest cities in Ancient Greece.

The people there were also very clever. They increased their wealth by producing their own coins. Anyone who wanted to buy or sell within the city had to swap their money for Corinthian coins... and had to pay extra to do so!

The Corinthians thought of riches only as money but riches can be more than material wealth. You can have riches beyond measure with the spiritual gifts of love, peace and joy.
